Which facilities for tourists and cyclists can you use?

The TouristPoint on Karlovo náměstí, house No. 47 in Třebíč. Right next to the Třebíč Information Centre.

What services does the TouristPoint offer?

Luggage storage in lockers • bike stands/self-service bike repair stands • WC • showers • sitting area.

What is interesting about the observation tower on the Pekelný kopec?

Superb views • interesting architecture.

Are there any facilities along the route from Třebíč to the observation tower?

Rest points • benches • fitness path known as the Pekelná stezka (Hellish Path) • shelters for tourists/signposts.

How can we navigate ourselves?

Follow the signposts • information boards • tourist guides for mobile phones and tablets.

Did you know?

The observation tower was designed by Pavel Jura, an architect from Brno, who was inspired by the cultural heritage of Třebíč and the surrounding countryside. He noticed the simple geometrical features in the St. Procopius Basilica in Třebíč that are repeated, multiplied, creating a harmonic unit. He also noticed a similar repetition of various features in the surrounding countryside. After visiting the Jewish Quarter in Třebíč, he came up with a layout for the observation tower, rotating two squares in order to replicate the Star of David that is geometrically created by two rotated triangles. The observation tower is 26.5 m high. There are 125 steps to reach the top, and the observation tower is situated 572 metres above sea level.
